About IPSC



The first meeting of the Indian Public Schools' Conference (India) was held at Gorton Castle Committee Room in Simla on 16th and 17th June 1939 under the Chairmanship of Mr. J.P. Sargent, Educational Commissioner with the Government of India. Mr. THL Smith Pearce, Principal, Raj Kumar College, Raipur was the First Organising Secretary. The meeting was convened mainly at the initiative of Mr. FG Pearce, Scindia School, Gwalior

This was just a preliminary meeting to consider the formation of the IPSC. The second regular formal meeting of the Conference was held at Scindia School, Gwalior on 23rd and 25th October of the same year.

"The objective of the meeting was to advise the government on educational problems, to educate the Indian public to appreciate the need for a number of first-class schools in India whose general training was designed to prepare students of ability for positions of leadership and responsibility in all walks of life....... This was an urgent need in a soon to be independent India."

In line with this aim, the four Chief's Colleges – Rajkumar College, Rajkot and Rajkumar College, Raipur, The Daly College and The Scindia School transformed themselves by admitting students who were not necessarily from the families of Chiefs or Princes. It was not a smooth transition and the determined Headmasters had to stand firm by their intentions. Soon other schools which were akin to the English Public-School system had joined in and the IPSC was born.

Indian Public Schools' Conference, formed in 1939 is known for its glorious traditions. The Indian Public Schools' have a distinct identity and it should not be confused with the large number of schools, which have liberally adopted the words 'Public School' with their name. The Indian Public Schools are 'private, independent and secular institutions of secondary education. The Sainik and Military Schools, which form part of the public-school complex have been established by the government and receive annual grants-in-aid. They are, however considered to be 'private' and 'independent' because they are managed by the autonomous Boards of Governors and are not obliged to follow the regulations of the grant-in-code.

Technically, an Indian Public School is one, which is a member of the IPSC. The IPSC which started in 1939 with a few residential schools has now strength of 79 schools including Sainik Schools and Military Schools. The conference has deliberated on the educational problems of residential schools and it endeavours to promote the efficiency of such schools keeping in mind the changing trends in the educational technology and maintaining our age-old traditions and heritage. IPSC is considered as an "integrative" organisation in the sense that directs "Motivation to the fulfilment of institutional expectation". The primary aim of Public School as stated in the IPSC Articles of Association is, "To prepare students of ability for positions of service and responsibilities in all walks of National Life".

The Indian Public Schools are mainly residential schools with an independent Board of Governors. Their aim is to provide boys/girls with opportunities for training in responsibility, leadership and service. Extensive facilities are available for a wide range of extra-curricular activities, games, athletics, physical education, crafts, arts, music, dramatics and a variety of hobbies. The central emphasis in both academics and extra-curricular activities is on the "All Round" development of character by the cultivation of academic skills and the qualities of initiative and responsibility, self-discipline, team-spirit, sportsmanship, fair-play, refined taste and the spirit of Public Service.

Editorial

I am filled with a sense of nostalgia while compiling this IPSC Journal as it was my very early predecessor, Mr. TLH Smith-Pearse (Principal, Rajkumar College, Raipur from 1931 to 1946), who was the driving force and founding father of this elite body! As we are all aware that the first meeting of the Heads of IPSC was held in 1939. Mr. TLS Smith-Pearse in his memoirs 'Past, Present and Future' has described this event...

"The Indian Public Schools Conference was started in 1939 by my friend, Mr. CH. Barry, Principal, Aitchison College, Lahore, and me. The founder-members were ourselves and the Heads of the Doon School, Dehra Dun; the Daly College, Indore; the Scindia School, Gwalior; the Rajkumar College, Rajkot; the Sri Shivaji School, Poona; and the Colvin College, Lucknow. Later, the last-named school dropped out, and up to the middle of 1945, no other school had joined the Conference, though in that year several other schools were thinking of doing so. However, in spite of the small number of member schools during the first six years of the existence of the Conference, I venture to say that it has been of great educational value not only to the members but also to many schools that are not members; and to predict that the Conference will grow into an important educational body in India".

However, very few of us are aware of the genesis of the idea of forming this school body germinated much before 1939. Mr. TLH Smith-Pearse touches upon this by mentioning the visit of Mr. & Mrs. C.H. Barry, Principal of Aitchison College, Lahore to Rajkumar College, Raipur in 1934.

He recalls "From this visit (SIC) dates a very friendship of my own, much cooperation and good feeling between the Aitchison College and the College, and - perhaps I may say - sowing of the seed that in 1939 germinated as the Indian Public School Conference". (sic)

Therefore, it is quite evident that this elite body was conceptualized and created much before the Indian Education System was formalized. The visionary thinking of IPSC founders in creating a resilient body that has withstood the test of times is laudable. This body has been instrumental in shaping the future of high-quality public school education since 1939 and continues to do so. It will be pertinent to mention here that on Mr. Pearse's initiative Rajkumar College, Raipur also hosted the first meeting of Assistant Masters of IPSC in 1944 which has been described by him in his memoirs,

"The first meeting of assistant masters of the Indian Public Schools Conference was held at the College in February 1944" unquote. He further adds the quote "The Indian Public Schools Conference started these annual meetings not only to enable assistant masters to consult together and put forward their views on subjects of interest to them but also to widen their outlooks by giving them opportunities to see other schools"

It is unfortunate that this century-old tradition of once a year conference of Heads of Public Schools has been rudely interrupted by these extraordinary times arising due to the pandemic. However, we should take this crisis as an opportunity as also a challenge, to further strengthen the bond and interaction between the IPSC schools. The world has shrunk due to the availability of the various digital platforms. I am glad to see significant co-curricular interaction between IPSC schools exploiting these platforms.

I would like to place on record my profound gratitude towards the Chairperson, IPSC, Ms. Nishi Misra and Honorary Secretary and Director Sports, IPSC, Dr.Jagpreet Singh, for their valuable inputs.

Lastly, let me commend the exceptional work done by the Editorial Team towards obtaining relevant information towards compiling, designing and proof reading of this journal during these Pandemic times.

80th IPSC Principal's

Conclave Highlights



For the record sixth time, Modern School, New Delhi hosted the Principals' Conclave of the Indian Public Schools' Conference (IPSC), including the momentous sessions viz. The Silver Jubilee and The Golden Jubilee Sessions. Modern School, New Delhi hosted the 80th Session of the IPSC Principals' Conclave from 5th to 7th January 2020 on the theme 'Education Four Point Zero'. The conclave was attended by 50 members, including the Heads of the IPSC Member-Schools and the IPSC Honorary Members. The programme commenced with its Executive Committee Meeting on 5th January 2020, followed by a Musical Presentation by the students and a Photograph of the delegates with Hon'ble Justice Sharad Arvind Bobde, Chief Justice of India, who graced the Inaugural Dinner.







On 6th January 2020, the Conclave commenced with the Flag Hoisting by the Chief Guest - Mr Amitabh Kant, CEO, Niti Aayog; followed by an official Photograph of the delegates with the Chief Guest and a Welcome Speech by Dr Vijay Datta, the Host Principal, wherein he emphasized on a significant role of the schools in the current times - to prepare students for the jobs that have not yet been created, for the technologies that have not yet been invented and to solve the problems that have not yet been anticipated. His purpose of highlighting these requirements was, to invite the attention of the academicians and policy makers towards the necessity of reforming the education system, to find answers to the issues such as (a) What kind of knowledge, skills, attitude and values do today's students need to thrive to shape their world? (b) How can instructional systems effectively develop these knowledge, skills, attitude and values?

Mr Amitabh Kant, an illustrious Modernite, graced the Conclave as the Chief Guest with his benign presence and his address was an inspiration to the galaxy of distinguished guests in the audience. The other highlights included the Keynote Address by Mr Shiv Khera, an eminent Modernite and a Motivational Speaker of international repute, Contemplation Session-1 by Dr Shyama Chona, former Principal of Delhi Public School, R.K.Puram and a renowned educationist, an Interaction amongst the Principals on



the 'Best Practices', a talk on 'Education 4.0: Reengineering for Deeper Learning Requires Deeper Thinking' followed by a session on 'STEM-Experiential Learning' by Dr Amitabh Sharma. The students of the host School presented a spectacular Horse Show and a Cultural Programme, which was appreciated by everyone.

On 7th January 2020, brainstorming Contemplation Sessions were conducted by eminent resource persons namely, Justice Siddharth Mridul, Hon'ble Judge of the Delhi High Court', Ambassador Mr Deepak Vohra, Dr Harmeet Rehan and Mr Sanjay Singh. The three-day Conclave concluded with the Annual General Meeting, where Ms Nishi Misra, Secretary I.P.S.C. was elevated to take charge as the new Chairperson of the I.P.S.C. The "Dr Gaur Hari Singhania I.P.S.C. Life Time Achievement Award" was conferred to Cdr V.K.Banga (Retd), Former Chairman,

I.P.S.C. for his excellent services in the field of Education. During the AGM, Ms Nishi Misra, Principal, Scindia Kanya Vidyalaya, Gwalior; Capt (IN) Alokesh Sen (Retd), Principal, Birla Public School (Vidya Niketan), Pilani and Dr Vijay Datta, Principal, Modern School, New Delhi, were felicitated for winning the National and the CBSE Awards.

A special programme was chalked out for the spouses of the delegates. Apart from attending the School's programme, they were taken for a visit to the Humayun's Tomb, Qutub Minar, Delhi Haat etc.

Modern School, New Delhi collated the requisite information from all the Member-IPSC Schools and got the 'IPSC Directory - 2019' published, which was formally released during the 80th Session of the IPSC Principals' Conclave, along with the 'IPSC Journal - 2019'.







Chairperson, IPSC



The year 2020 will be remembered as a watershed year on account of the Covid19 pandemic. Schools all over the country shut down on 18th March 2020 and have remained shut for over 7 months even as this goes into print.

This has had unprecedented implications for our schools, our nation and the entire world. The world of tomorrow, with its attendant pitfalls that we hitherto saw as a vague possibility on the far horizon was now knocking at our doors. We had no option but to rise to the occasion and respond.

Almost overnight, we trained and motivated our teachers to conduct online classes. Entire school communities upgraded their skills to provide continuity to curriculum transactions through an entirely unaccustomed media. The very technology that we shielded our students from became the tool for staying relevant.

IPSC too responded with unprecedented initiatives. We called the first ever extraordinary virtual meeting which marked a record attendance of members. We drew from the collective yet diverse wisdom of the members to lead our schools out of this adversity into a world of 'new normal'. A report was generated covering the Academic, Financial and Operational aspects of running our schools in the changed scenario.

I was called upon by the house to write to the Education Minister for changing the centres of our boarding students to their home districts for the pending board exams. I wrote to different Ministries and even the Association of Indian Universities. It took a great deal of liaison and persistence and finally we had success! Ultimately the pending exams were cancelled. Students were marked based on a formula.

Another first in IPSC was the IPSC Webinar with Mr. Anurag Tripathi, Secretary CBSE on New Opportunities in the New Normal which was widely attended and appreciated. Further, on the request of member schools, a manual of Suggested Strategies for Safety Protocols for IPSC Schools was created with the contributions of 9 School Heads. At the ECM of July 18th, we approved the compilation of the long awaited book: Glimpses of the Origins, Growth and Contributions of Indian Public Schools Conference. Guidelines for the use of the IPSC logo and the role of IPSC staff representative were finalised

The uncertainty of this situation is still frightening and frustrating. A brave new world is being born before our very eyes. We are called upon to display leadership in a greatly different paradigm. But the school teacher in us needs to remain ever optimistic. Our schools, our countrymen, the world and posterity will judge us for how we led our schools out of this adversity. We cannot fail them.

IPSC Introduction

The Indian Public Schools' Conference, which seeks to ensure that member schools pursue purely educational purposes, has been engaged in serving the cause of education in India by preparing the young for service and responsibility in national life through a holistic education. It also enthusiastically assists merited children from the weaker sections of society to have the facility of residential schooling. In order to discharge this obligation, IPSC runs its own Scholarship Scheme under the I PSC Trust.

The Indian Public Schools Conference Trust has been established with a view to provide scholarships, grants and interest-free loans to deserving but economically weak students on a merit-cum-means basis to help them pursue their studies in Public Schools which are members of the Indian Public Schools Conference. Besides, the Trust encourages and funds In-Service Training Programmes (INSET) for the staff of member schools to enable them to update their content and methodology of teaching. The Trust also recognises outstanding achievements of students at national level in games, sports and other activities. In addition, it conducts the prestigious IPSC GK Test every year.

While donations from philanthropists are welcome, the member schools generously contribute to the Scholarship Fund of the Trust. It is heartening to note that the fund has been increasing in size and so has been number of IPSC scholars. In addition, the member schools are encouraged to have their own scholarship schemes with their resources and possible help from their State Governments. The whole effort is to ensure that only deserving and meritorious students receive support.

The first Chairperson of the Trust was Ms. Sharada Mukherjee, the then Governor of Gujarat. The distinguished people like Shri Madhavrao Scindia, Shri LK Jha, Dr. (Mrs.) Madhuri Shah, Shri Nusli Wadia, Shri B Dadachandji and also our own veteran Principals Mr. Peter Rogerson, Mr. SR Das, Wg. Cdr. RM Saran (Ret I) and Dr. SD Singh have been the Founder Members of the Trust. Their pool of rich experience has helped in the smooth and efficient functioning of the Trust.

It is of interest to note that, though outside the purview of the IPSC Trust, students of Sainik Schools and Military Schools, who are members of IPSC, are granted scholarships in accordance with their rules & regulations. Thus, it is gratifying to see a sizeable number of meritorious but needy students from member schools enjoying financial support, partly or wholly.






child's throughout development- physical, social, emotional and cognitive.






school completing 75 years of its odyssey in pursuit of excellence.

On visiting the BRCM Public School one is struck by the scenic beauty of 100 acres of lush green and pollution free Vidyagram Campus. Far from the hustle and bustle of towns and cities, the essence of Indian ethos is so immaculately preserved that it would not be an exaggeration to call BRCM "An epitome of Gurukul System in tune with modern time" where the campus is fitted with 24 Mbps Wi-Fi net coverage and Educomp & smart classrooms."

The students who hail from different parts of India and abroad are brought up amidst natural surroundings away from the ills that torment big cities and towns at large. Thus they undergo holistic growth of body, mind and soul. Students are exposed to skills like rafting, trekking, rock climbing and river crossing. The personality development camp helps children to understand group dynamism. The overall atmosphere instills confidence within the child urging him to take initiatives in accepting the challenges of life.

The classrooms are airy, spacious and elegantly designed. An air-cooled Auditorium having a seating capacity of more than 1000 people, solar water heating system, a modern laundry, and sewage treatment plant (STP) and uninterrupted power generation unit add to the efficiency of the system. The school mess serves hygienic vegetarian food and caters to the needs of 800 students at a time. A modern bakery and cold storage are additional features of the mess.

A well furnished 10 beds infirmary with a resident medical officer, assisted by trained - paramedical staff, is adequately equipped to fulfill the medical requirements of the staff and the students. Apart from having various labs, a modern computerized library with around 25000 books, journals, and periodicals, facilitates the scholastic development of the student.

Professional coaching classes are arranged for students of class IX-XII, preparing them for the entrance examination to various Engineering, Medical, NDA, Hotel Management, NIFT and other courses in India and abroad.

The library also functions as a 'Resource Centre'. A mini library is provided in each hostel for self-study of the students. The foundation stone of the school building was laid in 1956 by Dr. S. Radhakrishnan, the then Vice President of India.

Functioning from a few tents pitched on the ground cleared from the onslaught of brambles in the 50s, the flagship school of the DPS fraternity blossomed into a training ground for achievers from all arenas during the 60s. The pandemic has revealed and exacerbated the mental and physical wellbeing of students especially with the disruption of their school year. At DPS Mathura Road, we have been undertaking activities for students to help them cope with their heath during the pandemic. A Webinar was held on the topic- "Importance of Mental wellbeing and social practices during Quarantine" with class 11th students. It covered various issues like coping up with mental health problems and other social practices during quarantine, its effects and consequences and solutions to it.

Covid-19 has changed the world forever. It has had a far reaching impact on students, teachers and their families.

Closure of schools saw an initial period of rapid adaptation. It prompted us to rethink the conventional mode of education. Learning commenced at DPS Mathura Road after swift digitalization of curriculum.

At the Pre Primary and Primary level classes were divided into two teams with the ratio of 1:17 (approx.) Classes are being held through MS TEAMS with a live session for the core subject and WhatsApp classes for co-curricular activities.

At the Secondary and Senior Secondary level Google Meet is being used as the platform to facilitate learning. Here the challenges faced differ. After hours of collaborative work teachers are preparing simple power point presentations with illustrations that are colourful and attractive, organising games, live sessions of interesting activities and imparting education by

creating videos for storytelling, poetry recitation and other subject related topics. New ways of design and delivery of content have brought about a transparency in the academic system.

Aided by digitization, the syllabus is covered in a methodical and organised way with an improvement in learning material. Assessment techniques have been refined to suit the new medium. For Mid Term Exams of Classes IX, X, XI and XII the online Portal has been provided by Think Merit. This is for the conduct of fair online examinations. It ensures continuity of the academic session and helps in preserving academic integrity. With features like real time monitoring of assessments by live proctors with audio and video features, it has proved to be successful so far.

The measures undertaken by the school have been met with an overwhelming response from the students. Co curricular activities are taking place online. Virtual assemblies to commemorate Independence Day and Teacher's Day were efficiently showcased. A compendium of Debate and Literary competitions has taken place using the online platform of Google Meet, More such virtual competitions have been planned in the coming months.

However the impact of the pandemic has been more severe for disadvantaged children and their families. To mitigate it, personal attention is being given to children with special needs and EWS students through video calls. The counsellors have adapted new procedures to handle various psychological pressures. The school counsellor as the special educator in the Enrichment Centre helps and guides children at all times.

All academic meetings, seminars and conferences have moved online, teleconferencing has become the norm. Teachers are undergoing rigorous training to keep themselves updated with the new ways of delivery and assessments. Workshops and webinars organized by Delhi Public School Society HRD Centre, CBSE, the Directorate of Education, the newly formed Education Ministry are supporting them in their endeavours.

Human instincts have always carved innovative solutions to win over difficulties. The implementation of the National Education Policy and its transformation in the Education Sector has become more feasible. Although we have a long way to go before digital learning is seen as a vital part of mainstream education, we have taken a giant leap in that direction.



The school has participated in many IPSC Cultural and Sports activities. The activities offer opportunities to students to discover their strengths. The students of








Donyi Polo Vidya Bhawan have proven that they are no longer deprived of the chance to show their talents at national level events and competitions.

The cultural ethos of the School stands as an exemplar for our girls to imbibe and practice all that is good and noble around them.




nurtured. Also every child needs the opportunity to express his / her ideas, views and exhibit skills. Therefore the existing education system must aim towards producing a good and strong individual.

The growth of this institution has been phenomenal under the enlightened leadership of Padma Bhushan late Shri Balasaheb Vikhe Patil, former Union Cabinet Minister. Established in 1945 as King George Royal Indian Military College (KGRIMC) Belgaum,

the KGRIMC Belgaum (and the other five sister institutions) provided free education to the sons of NCOs, JCOs and Ors to prepare them for the Army examinations including the Indian Special Certificate of Examination. The curriculum was based on military requirements and the medium of instruction was English. After Independence, a Parliamentary Committee headed by the renowned educationist Dr H N Kunjru recommended reorganization of these schools on lines of Public Schools like the Lawrence School, Sanawar and Doon School, Dehradun. In 1952, the Ghosh Committee recommended changes in the objectives of these institutions. Accordingly, the cadets were now free to join any profession without obligation to join compulsorily the Armed Forces. In the same year, these Schools also became the founder members of the Indian Public Schools Conference (IPSC).

Like the other members of the IPSC, Rashtriya Military School, Belgaum is a residential school following a curriculum aimed at developing leadership qualities in its students. It aims to inculcate in its students a multitude of skills and attitudes, instilling into them values of honesty and integrity, equality and secularism, self-confidence and self-worth, social obligations and patriotism, thus enabling them to



make intelligent, meaningful and ethical contribution to society.

Rashtriya Military School, Belgaum has consistently been among the top 20 best Boys Boarding Schools in India for the last 4 years. In the India School Rankings 2017-18, published 'Education World', Rashtriya Military School. The event drew participation of boxers from various Public Schools across the length and breadth of the country. The School teamconsisted of 14 cadets from Wt categories ranging from 28-30 Kg to 80+ Kg.



The Rashtriya Indian Military College (RIMC), earlier known as the Prince of Wales Royal Indian Military College, is amongst the oldest public schools in the country. It was inaugurated on 13 March 1922 by His Royal Highness, Prince Edward VIII, the Prince of Wales, in order to provide Indian Boys with avant garde education and training designed to arm, the Indians destined to join the Royal Military College, Sandhurst, with adequate brains and brawn, as part of the Indianisation program of the Officer cadre of the Indian Army. He is the 9th Rimcollian to serve his alma mater as the head of the family. He was at the NDA from 1986 to 1988, at the IMA from Jan 1989 to Dec 1989 and was commissioned into the 5



Rajputana Rifles. He also served as an Instructor at CIJWS in Mizoram and led the NCC Delegation to Russia. He has participated in operations like Prakram in Rajasthan and Rakshak in J&K. He has recently completed his M Phil in defence and strategic studies from Pune University. Prior to taking over as the Commandant, he was commanding 3 Guj Girls Bn NCC in Bhavnagar, Gujarat.







The school with its sister institution at Jhelum (Pakistan) came into existence after the First World War with a generous donation of Rs. 2.5 lakhs from King George V's Patriotic Fund. The foundation stone of the school was laid by the then Prince of Wales in Feb 1922 and the school started functioning at Jalandhar Cantt on 15 Sep 1925. The School was christened as King George's Royal Indian Military College (KGRIMC). This institution was founded with the aim of imparting free education to the sons of JCOs, NCOs and OR to prepare them for various Army Examinations including the Indian Special Certificate of Education. The entire curriculum was based on Military requirements with English as medium of instruction. The strength of the school was 250 and the staff consisted mostly Military personnel. During the World War-II the school was designated as College. One hundred more boys (then called cadets) were admitted under the expansion scheme. The conditions of admission were relaxed to accommodate the near relatives of Army Personnel and admission was thrown open to all branches of Armed Forces. The college was affiliated to the Punjab University for Matriculation and Intermediate examinations. This Institution produced a large number of Officers. The college was renamed as King George's School and shifted to NOWGONG (Bundel khand) in August 1952 where it was housed in Old Kitchner College buildings. After Independence it was felt that these schools should impart liberal education and should have a wider social

basis. Consequently these schools were re-organised in Sep 1952 and half of the seats of total of 300 were thrown open to sons of Civilians and Armed Forces Officers. The school was renamed again as Chail Military School with effect from 01 Jan 1966, Military School, Chail from 1996 and now as Rashtriya Military School, Chail wef 25 Jun 2007. Boys are now prepared for Senior School Certificate Examination of the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi under 10+2 scheme.


was a reflection of progress while working together as a team can be spelt as success in real terms.


the Armed Forces and in other walks of life, creating an enviable history of proud achievements.

J Krishnamurti, Education and Significance of Life

Rishi Valley School started in 1931 and is the first school established by Krishnamurti. Jiddu Krishnamurti (1895-1986) whose life and teachings spanned the greater part of the 20th Century, is regarded by many as one who has had the most profound impact on human consciousness in modern times. He travelled round the world till the age of 90 giving talks, writing, holding discussions. His purpose was to set humankind unconditionally free from the destructive limitations of the conditioned mind.

Rishi Valley School is located in an isolated valley in the interior of Andhra Pradesh in South India. Carved out of ancient granite rock, the valley stands in a rain shadow area at the edge of the Eastern Ghats. Within it are located several small hamlets inhabited by shepherds, marginal farmers, and resettled tribal populations. A remarkable atmosphere of peace and serenity pervades the landscape.

While remaining dedicated to J. Krishnamurti's challenging vision of education, the school has evolved meaningful curricula that is regularly reviewed and updated. Rishi Valley Schoolis an all-boarding school

with students from different states of India and highly qualified members of the faculty. We believe competition creates fear, which makes students concentrate more on success than on learning. As the child begins to conform, she/he loses subtlety and freshness of the mind. Therefore, our school does not focus on examinations, except in classes 10 and 12.

In keeping with Krishnamurti's vision, several outreach programmes have grown as part of Rishi Valley Education Centre. They are resource centres for the countryside. These include an innovative programme for rural education; a health centre which, apart from treating patients, conducts research in mental health and chronic diseases; a bio-diversity Park; a bird study unit; and watershed management initiative for water and soil conservation.

The conservation work of Rishi Valley Education Centre concentrates on the following areas: water conservation; reforesting barren hill slopes; soil and moisture conservation and wasteland development; use of alternative energy. More than five decades of water harvesting has resulted in the construction of seven percolation tanks at the edge of the campus and on hillsides. A once barren hillside adjacent to the school is now part scrubland and part forest and an instituted Bird Sanctuary, cited by the International Council for Bird Preservation. For the local village community, the regenerated hillside means fodder for its animal population and fuel wood; the space is a kind of insurance against long periods of drought.

Electricity from solar power accounts for more than 50 percent of the needs of the school.

young impressionable mind and equip them with tools to be better human beings. As we do this, we make our lives meaningful in a thousand ways and help make the lives of others better.



Historical Importance of Balachadi: The ravages of the Second World War left Poland a shadow of the country it once was. The nation was torn apart by destructive forces, its people held captive in concentration camps and countless of its children left orphans. Thousands of Polish children sought political asylum and stayed in Balachadi during the World War II and were staying in the campus from 1942 - 46.

The Maharaja of Jamnagar took many personal risks to ensure that more than 640 women and children found a safe haven in Balachadi. He didn't just provide the Polish citizens with the bare necessities either, but went to great lengths to ensure that Balachadi became a home away from home for these people.

Thus saving more than 640 polish children's has made this place an historical importance in the history of Poland and India.

Introduction: The Sainik School Balachadi is situated at a very picturesque and pleasant nook of Jamnagar. The land and some buildings of His Highness the Jam Saheb of Nawanagar which was handed over to the State Government to be used by the School are still resplendent with their past glory and fame.

Sainik School Balachadi is the only school of its kind in the State of Gujarat, providing residential, military based,

CBSE education to the youth of this state. This is more popularly known as a feeder institution to the prestigious National Defence Academy.

The School was inaugurated by the then Prime Minister Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri on 07 Mar 1965 at Balachadi, 30 km away from Jamnagaf. Situated along the sea shore, Balachadi provides an ideal and beautiful locale for good residential education. The 291 acres of land is spotted with different flora and a much wider variety of fauna.

The aim of instituting a Sainik School in the state of Gujarat was to prepare the youth of the state academically, physically and mentally for entry into the National Defence Academy. The other motives included are removal of regional imbalances in the officer cadre





of the Defence forces, development of good qualities in physical, mental and moral spheres of a child and to bring the dream of public school education within the reach of a common man.

Admission to the School is a very tightly contested affair and every year the School (having a total capacity of 576



boys) takes in fresher's for Class VI and IX Boys between the ages of 10-12 years are taken in Class VI and 13-15 years are taken in Class IX. The first step to the coveted entry is an All India Written Examination, followed by a medical examination.









Sainik School Bijapur (SSBJ) is the 13th School in the chain of 33 Sainik Schools in the country, established by Ministry of Defense, Govt of India. The foundation stone was laid by then Prime Minister, late Smt Indira Gandhi and the School started functioning from 16 Sep 1963. The School has contributed well over 500 Officers to the Armed Forces. 






realize optimum potential of young minds. These schools offer a vast array of opportunities to channelize their energies into constructive purposes.

Introduction. Sainik School Sujanpur Tira is the 18th Sainik School in India. It was inaugurated on 02 November 1978, when the then President of India, His Excellency, Shri Neelam Sanjeeva Reddy inaugurated and dedicated the School to the Nation.

The aim of Sainik School Sujanpur Tira is to prepare boys academically, physically and mentally for entry into NDA. The other objectives of the scheme are:-

- To remove regional imbalance in the officer cadre of the defence services.
- (b) To develop qualities of body, mind and character which will enable the young boys of today to become good and useful citizens of tomorrow.
- (c) To bring public school education within the each of the common man.

Organisational Set-up. Sainik Schools are managed by Sainik Schools Society registered under the Societies Registration Act under the aegis of Govt of India, Ministry of Defence, New Delhi. The Society is governed by the Board of Governors followed by Executive Committee headed by RRM and Defence Secretary respectively. Joint Secretary (Trg& CAO), Honorary Secretary and two Inspecting Officers look after the School affairs at various levels in New Delhi. Location. SujanpurTira is located 24 Kms from its district HQ Hamirpur and is connection to all other places in the State by road. Its nearest broad-gauge railhead is located 90 Kms away at Una. A narrow-gauge train operates between Pathankot and Maranda (Palampur)

which is 45 Km. away. Kangra Airport at Gaggal is located 75 Km. from SujanpurTira. Infrastructure. The School has about 31 acres of land and its campus is divided into 05 pockets at different locations namely-

- (a) Academic Block & Chougan
- (b) Hostels & Cadets' Mess
- (c) Chougan Staff Colony
- (d) Hill Top Staff Colony
- (e) Khadola Staff Colony

The six hostels are named after the perennial rivers of India namely, Jhelum, Beas, Satluj, Yamuna, Chenab & Ravi.



During the current Academic session 2020-21 this School is gearing up for one of the most unprecedented challenges of all time, namely, the COVID-19 Pandemic. The School infrastructure being rudimentary in nature, unlike most other IPSC Schools, and there being no speciality or super-speciality hospitals in the vicinity, it is indeed a challenge to make the School operational by screening close to 530 boarders, coming from the length and breadth of the country, quarantining them, and ensuring that there are no carriers of this deadly virus among the cadets.


wherein they can highlight the elixir in their pedagogical system for others to learn and imbibe.

Sandur Residential School, Sandur (KA)



The wall suddenly collapsed you may guess which, where and when. The wall between the home and job suddenly crumbled down and merged as one platform.

'Stay safe- Work from home' - statements were strictly issued by the Govt. throughout India. Unfortunately March month everyone marched out of their campuses to be locked up in their homes. Never before we faced such a situation.

'Covid-19' - slowly spread its' tentacles and engulfed the world in its web - what a trauma?

Only 25 families were left at SRS campus. Both gates were locked – no one was allowed to go or come into the campus. After two long months in May we decided to start online classes for Std X. Management arranged for online orientation sessions for teachers- how to schedule a meeting on Zoom, prepare slides, download videos, animations, use of pointer etc.

Then we bought licensed version of Zoom app and 10 classrooms were given internet landline connections. As a Principal had Zoom meeting with all the students and parents to instruct them about online classes and precautions to be taken.

So with all the preliminary work is done, teachers started gearing up for online classes. All were enthusiastic and eager to learn and display their skills. After the trial rounds we started online classes for Std X on 18th May and then after a month Std IX & VIII. We were very much concerned, about the health of both teachers and students and had to take precautions. So

started conducting 3 periods per day with a duration of 40 minutes each. So the exposure to the screen was not too much.

Transitioning from offline to online for many teachers was a challenge as there was no eye contact with the students. Teachers had prepared very interactive and interesting lessons with colourful slides and uploaded videos that caught the attention of students. Assignments were posted on Whatsapp or pdf by the students.

Then from 1st of August online classes started for all the other classes. On 15th Aug. Managing Director of SMIORE Bahirji A Ghorpade hoisted the flag in the campus – teachers attended with social distancing in the open Diamond Jubilee courtyard. Campus children sang 'Hum Honge Kamyab ek din' from Covid-19 and also entertained by dressing as 'Covid warriors'.

In mid August we again conducted a training session for teachers on different modes of online assessment. They learnt Testmoz, Google form, Google classroom and implemented for Unit tests and Terminal exam. Besides, they learnt concept board, Google form – graded quiz, Jamboard. Teachers recapitulated the lessons by concept boards and quiz.


Students V to IX enjoyed making concept boards and Jamboards as assignments.

Now the students can access to free of charge multiple resources via internet. Std IX and X started submitting their projects online and offline. Students were given









options to choose any mode to submit their assignment. Their engagement levels shot way up and their creativity was on full potential. Many students who were quiet and shy in the classroom became more participatory in online class activities.

Giving students choices for showcasing their learning has made them feel more valued and positive in their thought process.

Teaching methodology followed by teachers was by creating smaller modules with practical activities which made it more interesting. Once in a month we showcased 5 minutes videos to inculcate good moral values as a part of personality development.

The experience of pandemic as schools were shut down, students and teachers became aware of the new reality-online. Students and teachers have become more responsible, purposeful and disciplined in their work.

But everyone is missing school - the ringing of the bell, wearing beautiful dresses, assembly and most important during break sharing their lunch boxes and expressing their emotions. Lockdown has locked every one's emotion. But 24X7 mobile rings. 24X7 kitchen is open..... teachers are doing balancing Act. Students are missing their friends and games period.

All teachers are the unsung warriors who have not stopped working for the sake of the children to keep their brains active.

Yes they were nervous in the beginning - hands were shaking to turn their camera on for the first time, but once they started there was no looking back.

We hope and pray this pandemic will end soon. School campus will buzz again. Vaccine is launched soon and we roam about freely on this planet earth as before.


acknowledge the fact that we have not lost sight of that despite Sikkim merging with India and decades having flown.

Das aspired to set up a school which was open to all, unlike the existing boarding schools then that admitted only British pupils or served India's wealthy elite and were Christian in ethos. The Doon School was envisioned as an entirely secular school that would attract boys from all sections of Indian society and from every state in India; boys who would go on to serve a free and democratic India.

A 70 acre residential school, situated at the foot of the Himalayas, is home to approximately 500 boys aged 11-18 years. The estate has hundreds of species of flora and fauna and the environment enables boys to be truly inspired and creative at every stage of school life. 




The entire credit for this success goes to the teachers, who have been working relentlessly in making the online classes engaging and interesting. The support from the management has been pivotal and instrumental throughout.



Last, but by no means the least, the school administration has laid significant emphasis on mental well being.



As the pandemic affected the economy and the mental health






acumen but also comprehensive skills and a mindset that makes our students intelligent, morally upright, socially sensitive, secular contributors to our society.

The Lawrence School, Lovedale as it stands today is in the dynamic process of traversing an eventful path from past glories to newer, brighter horizons. Standing firm on its distinguished lineage, the School is charting a new course in all aspects of curricular and co-curricular touchstones.

Lovedale is situated about 6 kilometres from Ootacamund, on the central plateau of the Nilgiri Hills. The school stands on its own estate, about 710 acres, and the local railway station, Lovedale, which is on the Ootacamund - Mettupalayam metre gauge hill Railway adjoins the School estate.

The School was primarily instituted on 6th September, 1858 in the memory of Major General Sir Henry Lawrence, KCB to provide vocational education to the orphans and the other children of European soldiers in India.

The School played its part in the First World War (1914 – 1918), with the boys and the staff garrisoned at Wellington. The Principal heard from 220 boys serving on various fronts, from among whom,18 were subsequently martyred. For the service rendered, the School boys received 17 honours and distinctions and 40 General Service Medals.

In 1922, His Royal Highness, the Duke of Connaught and Strathearn graciously consented to become the Patron of the School. Three years later, the School was placed under a Board of Trustees, the administration being entrusted to a Board of Governors; and on 1st September, 1925, His Majesty, the King-Emperor George V, gave his assent to designate the School: The Lawrence Memorial Royal Military School, Lovedale.

The School was under British administration until May, 1949, after which the school was handed over to the Government of India. On the 6th of September, 1949, the School was presented the Indian Union colour, which replaced the old King's Colour. After the takeover by the Government of Independent India, it was run as a public school, open to all, with a 40 percent reservation of seats and a 20 percent fee subsidy, for children of Defence Personnel.

With the passage of time, the School has grown from strength to strength and from a humble beginning of 12 pupils, the School now has over 850 on its rolls. Since its foundation, several luminaries have passed through its portals, firmly etching a niche for themselves on the world arena; living up to the motto of their alma mater of 'Never Give in'.

The administration of The Lawrence School, Lovedale is now vested in an autonomous body known as the Board of Governors appointed by the Government of India, Ministry of Human Resource Development. The School is neither exclusive nor elitist and it maintains a Secular



and Cosmopolitan culture. In fact, the School is a microcosm of India, for children from many communities from all parts of the country and overseas study here.

Today, with its national ranking among Indian public schools on a steady rise, the School is poised to take a leap towards striking the delicate balance between academic and non-academic competence nurturing holistic development, thereby assuring its name for all of posterity.

Not many schools in India would have existed during the Spanish Flu or Bombay Fever as it was known in India in 1918. The Lawrence School, Lovedale did. Established in 1858, our School takes pride in its tradition and history and it has stood the test of time and pandemics. This time though, the challenges are different. True to the School motto, we shall 'Never Give In'.

We began conducting online classes by 20 April 2020 after we educated ourselves on online learning platforms. Weekly time tables were structured and sent to students and parents.



Besides online classes, online assessments, assignments, online quizzes, career counseling, hobby classes, online MUN are being held. A weekly 'Knowledge Sharing Initiative's being conducted for our pupils by our Alumni.

Today, we have made a substantial impact on the learning process as we have created a new ecosystem where the student feels connected with their home away from home – The Lawrence School, Lovedale.

We understand that this is just the beginning and we still have a long way to go. We shall 'Never Give In!


the seven hundred fifty acre campus wherein we have almost all the sports available in the country from Archery to Equestrian.



Career guidance for the IX -XII graders has been made accessible for the students through webinars by renowned universities.




The next decade, perhaps, will be globalized by way of collaboration and student exchange programs, with the world agreeing on a common curriculum bringing the nations further closer and better connected.


The first step toward this transformation is to understand what innovation means in the context of education. For years, we have taught students to find correct answers; now we need to get them all to produce different ones! By far the most effective and yet most simple is the use of questioning. By asking open-ended questions, teachers could spark curiosity, encourage research and engage students in real time learning to result in far greater learning outcomes than expected in the curriculum. Teachers could be asking open-ended questions in any subject to building thinking skills.

Other very effective strategies that nurture skills needed for innovation are real-world problem solving through project - based learning, flipped teaching, cooperative and cooperative, learning, design change projects.

A very pertinent question that I am often asked is how feasible is this- given the quality and logistics of teachers we have. 'Challenging —but not impossible and at the end, extremely gratifying'- I answer, based on my own experiences.

For survival in the 4th industrial revolution, creative thinking must be a habit with the gen Z.Teaching thinking must, therefore, be independent of budgets and infrastructural constraints, so children have universal access to learning this vital skill. All it needs is the will to learn and make a difference: by teachers and students alike. Teachers can develop skills needed for the 21st-century classroom by investing just their time- a plethora of self-learning material and free apps are available on the web to help them teach innovation. Supported by leaders and management who are committed to transforming schools for the digital age, innovation is not a distant dream anymore.




Schools' Conference (IPSC) has increased manifold.

It boasts of an illustrious range of alumnae, especially Ranjitsinhji and Duleepsinhji.






continues to dedicate itself to the original objective of the IPSC; that is, to prepare students of ability for positions of leadership and responsibility in all walks of life.

With their experience and expertise of respective knowledge domains, they also take out time for their wellbeing. Mindfulness sessions, joyful meets, and virtual corridors have become an integral part of their new normal.

Optimum security measures for the wellbeing of the staff residing on campus is ensured through security checks like thermal scanners, fountain sanitization et cetera, at the school entrance. The movements of staff off-campus are restricted and arrangements for the supply of properly sanitized essential commodities through authorized vendors is made available on the campus.

The School has devised an effective plan of action for the safe return of girls in a sprawling campus once the reopening of schools is approved.

- Arrival in a Phased Manner
 - 700 resident scholars will return classwise in a phased manner carrying a COVID clearance report and will be quarantine in small groups for a week.
- Restructuring Classroom Setup & Other Activities
 - Online and offline classes for a group of maximum 15 girls in a class maintaining two-meter distance and the fixed seating arrangement. All other group activities have been restructured to ensure social distancing.
- Restructuring the Boarding Houses & Dining Hall Operations

Minute guidelines on the entry and exit to the Houses, handling of personal belongings, and routine cleanliness have been defined. The School Dining Hall will cater to students in shifts by the dedicated food handlers as per the guidelines of the WHO and other organisations.

Yadavindra Public School, Patiala, was founded under the patronage of His Highness Maharajadhiraj Yadavindra Singh, the 9th Ruler of the erstwhile State of Patiala. The School was, chiefly, established to accommodate the evacuee students of Aitchison College, Lahore, Pakistan, who had shifted to India after the country's partition in 1947, and wished for a school of a similar rank and standing as their earlier institution.

The School began to function on February 2, 1948. The initial strength was of 9 teachers and 21 students. The first Headmaster was Rai Bahadur Dhaniram Kapila, former Principal of Aitchison College. He had moved to Patiala and taken over the charge at the insistence of His Highness Yadavindra Singh, who himself was an old Aitchisonian.


Since then , in true public school tradition and in accordance with the vision of its Founders, the School has striven to provide a comprehensive , all -inclusive and all -round education to its students to achieve a harmonious growth of their minds and bodies and ensure a balanced growth of all their faculties- physical, emotional, intellectual, creative, cognitive and spiritual.

The School, over the years, has grown in stature and repute and witnessed exponential growth.

To accommodate the rising number of boarders, three Boarding Houses came up in the very first decade. Similarly, the School joined prestigious bodies such as the IPSC and turned co-educational. The strength continued to grow and presently stands at over 1500 students and 100 staff members

The infrastructure has grown in the same proportion. The School is spread over an area of 46 acres and has spacious smart classrooms fitted with inter-active boards, Science, Computer, English and Mathematics









laboratories, well -stocked libraries, Art, Dance and Music rooms. The building has separate wings for the Senior, Middle and Junior sections.

YPS, Patiala, is one of the very few schools to offer as many as 22 sports disciplines . These, besides team games , include facilities for individual sports like archery, fencing , shooting , boxing , horse -riding , swimming and squash . YPS is the only school to own an Olympic-sized Stadium with a 400m cinder track and a velodrome.

Similarly, in the field of co-curricular and extra –curricular activities, varied participation is made in debates, declamations, quizzes, writing contests and in MUN and Round Square conferences. Students regularly attend leadership summits and conclaves, IT, ICT and IPSC literary fests all over the country and abroad.

Career guidance and counselling is an important facet of the School's curriculum. The School, lately, has been availing professional help of renowned career experts and counsellors like Edu-velocity and Univariety in this regard.

The biggest challenge has been to address the issues arising out of the sudden closedown of the educational institutions and the abrupt disruption of regular studies. The online classes, if not absolutely, have to a large extent helped in filling up the void created in the absence of regular classes. As the wont is, YPS too is following a meticulously drawn schedule for an effective conduct of these online classes which started in April. The number of classes which initially varied between 3-5 per day was, subsequently, increased to 4 and 5 per day in the Junior School and the Senior School, respectively. Whereas the classes in the Junior School are more activity- based with focus on Yoga, music, dance, art and aerobics, in the Senior School the classes are more curriculum based. Special classes are being conducted in life skills and extra-curricular activities, besides counselling sessions for the students. YPS plans to continue this arrangement partially even at the reopening of the schools.

Academic terms have culminated in online evaluation, posed in the form of quizzes, oral presentations, objective and essay type questions using the Skolaro App. School students have attended/continue to attend virtual Round Square and MUN Conferences, debates, elocution and art competitions held by different schools. Non-contact games-tennis, badminton, athletics, yoga and horse riding-commenced in July .

Other important activities such as staff and parentteacher meetings are also being conducted through the virtual medium .

The School management donated-550 PPE kits, 300 N95 masks and 300 face shields to the Patiala district nominated COVID Hospital.


School staff donated their one-day salary towards the Chief Minister Relief Fund-COVID-19

It was in the year 1950 that the School, under the auspices of its Founder and the then Patron, His Highness Yadavindra Singh, joined the prestigious federation, along with other reputed public schools of the time.



The School, since then has , in letter and spirit , endeavoured to faithfully perform the guidelines and successfully implement all the programmes suggested and laid down by the body . The school students , in keeping with the broad aims and objectives of the confederacy , take part in all activities-curricular and co-curricular- to achieve a balanced and harmonious growth of their minds and bodies . In the same way , YPS, Patiala, has been hosting IPSC events periodically through the years. We hope to strengthen this relationship and take it leaps forward in the years to come .

It is , indeed , a proud moment that the IPSC has announced its Annual Journal which will be a compilation of events undertaken by its member schools under the flagship of the organisation . Although it cannot be denied that the present edition of the journal is being released in the most unusual circumstances as the schools were forced to shut almost seven months ago because of the COVID -19 outbreak . But, at the same time , it is comforting to see how the schools tried cover up the loss by conducting online schools . It is equally heartwarming to see our students participate in online activities with the same zest and fervour even in these inclement times.

YPS students, in the past seven months, have taken part in a large number of virtual activities such as MUN and Round Square Conferences, essay writing, art and photography contests, IAYP, SUPW and NSS activities and some valuable state sponsored programmes- all to satisfying results.

As the things stand in October now, we are on the anvil of reopening school for classes IX -XII. The other classes shall follow suit ,albeit in a graded manner. The online learning shall remaining the preferred mode of learning, coupled with regular school which shall be delimited to resolution of doubts and addressing specific problems.

We, and I am sure all other like -minded schools in the country, see this as a new opportunity, a new beginning that shall help us return to normal times once again.

The heads of the following schools had a meeting in Shimla in June 1939: Rajkumar College, Rajkot, Rajkumar College, Raipur, Daly College, Indore, Doon School, Dehra Dun, Scindia School, Gwalior, Bhonsala Military School, Nashik and Achison College, Lahore. J.P.Sargent, Educational Commissioner, Govt. Of India, was also present and chaired the meeting. They discussed the possibility of starting an Association. As a consequence of the discussions, the headmasters, foremost of them being F.G.Pearce, who had had long association with education in India, who was then head of Scindia School and later, of Rishi Valley School, started an Association. The first Headmasters' Conference of India was held later in 1939 at RKC, Raipur, with the above mentioned Heads as the nucleus and they drafted a preliminary Memorandum of Association and Rules. Slowly, the movement picked up and various modalities were worked out. Two people played a vital role in the establishment of the Association. F.G.Pearce and J.P.Sargent, who had made it his mission "to promote establishment of schools on public school lines with such adjustments to meet Indian conditions as necessary."

At the supplementary conference held in October 1940 at RKC, Raipur, after much deliberation, the heads decided to call themselves INDIAN PUBLIC SCHOOLS CONFERENCE. Birla Public School, Pilani, joined the conference soon after, as also Modern School, Barakhamba Road, Delhi Public School, Mathura Road, and other reputed schools like The Lawrence Schools, Sanawar and Lovedale joined and the number went up. In the late fifties, Mr V.K.KrishnaMenon, then Defence Minister, took the bold step at one stroke to establish a network of Sainik Schools to serve as feeders to N.D.A. No other leader ever created so many boarding schools at a short time. They were modelled on the Public School pattern and gradually became members of the Conference.

By the Silver Jubilee year, 1964there were 26 members and by the Golden Jubilee year in 1989, the strength of the conference rose to 64 and to 81 by the Platinum Jubilee year in 2014. The intake of more schools led to more middle class children joining the schools. This coincided with increase in number of scholarships and bursaries. The schools were no longer perceived as exclusive preserves of the rich. The criticism of the schools as elitist institutions became feebler, leading to more and more schools desiring to join the Conference. While the member schools zealously safeguarded and improved their standards, norms for admission of new members and procedures for detailed inspection of prospective members were worked out. Senior members were drafted to inspect the schools after which the decision to admit a new member was taken by the IPSC on the basis of their report. Alongside the stringent criteria for admission, there is quality assurance at every stage. The Heads meet once a year at a member

school for three days, deliberate on the problems and challenges faced by them and endeavour to arrive at a common approach to the issues. There is commendable bonhomie among the heads. The schools function in cooperation and competition happily is absent.

The alumni of public schools are found all over the world in various fields of activity. The schools hold alumni meets periodically to keep contact with the alumni who are keen to help their Alma Mater in every possible way.

As seen above, the Indian Public School is like Triveni, a confluence of three streams flowing underneath:

The old Gurukul system which is in our racial unconscious.

The genius of modern Indian education with its tradition of excellence.

The good points of English Public Schools suitably adapted to Indian education so that the schools are INDIAN in every sense.

The Indian Public Schools Conference Trust was established in 1985 with a view to providing scholarships, grants and support to students of member schools on merit-cum-means basis.

While donations from philanthropists are welcome, the member schools generously contribute to the Scholarship Fund of the Trust. It is heartening to note the steady increase in number of scholars. In addition, the member schools are encouraged to have their scholarship schemes with their resources and possible help from State Governments.

We have had on the Trust in the past eminent personalities like Smt. Sharada Mukherjee who had been the first President, ShriMadhavraoScindia, ShriL.K.Jha, Dr(Mrs) Madhuri Shah, ShriNusliWadia, ShriJ.B.Dadachandji and also our own veteran Principals –Mr Peter Rogerson, Mr S.R.Das, Wg Cdr R.M.Saran and Dr S.D.Singh. Their pool of rich experience has helped in the smooth and efficient functioning of the Trust.



The National Education Policy 2020 is a very comprehensive document which has been released with a lot of publicity, even fanfare. It is a policy document which has taken five years to prepare and has come after a long time, the last NEP being dated 1986. The Policy addresses both the mechanical and the qualitative aspects of education from the Pre-Primary level up to higher research and adult education.

What I want to cite here is the exact language from the NEP 2020, Part 1, (School Education) Chapter 4 (Curriculum and Pedagogy in Schools), Para 23:

Curricular Integration of Essential Subjects, Skills, and Capacities

4.23. While students must have a large amount of flexibility in choosing their individual curricula, certain subjects, skills, and capacities should be learned by all students to become good, successful, innovative, adaptable, and productive human beings in today's rapidly changing world. In addition to proficiency in languages, these skills include: scientific temper and evidence-based thinking; creativity and innovativeness; sense of aesthetics and art; oral and written communication; health and nutrition; physical education, fitness, wellness, and sports; collaboration and teamwork; problem solving and logical reasoning; vocational exposure and skills; digital literacy, coding, and computational thinking; ethical and moral reasoning; knowledge and practice of human and Constitutional values; gender sensitivity; Fundamental Duties; citizenship skills and values; knowledge of India; environmental awareness including water and resource conservation, sanitation and hygiene; and current affairs and knowledge of critical issues local communities, states, the country, and the world.

I urge you to read that again! In short, once a child emerges from school, they must be a ready-made perfect citizen of the country and the world they must be 'glocal', they must be 'hi-tech-hi-touch', good at STEAM subjects, multi-faceted, multitasking, supremely communicative and effective individuals. And it is the job of the schools and the teachers to achieve this and create this near-perfect young girl or young man just stepping into adult life.

If there has been any one association or cadre of schools which has sot itself a similar vision and aim for the past NINE decades or 80, it is the Indian Public Schools' Conference member schools. These schools recognized long ago that these Aims could be fulfilled in a residential set up which affords the and teachers the time to pursue a curriculum which encompasses all aspects of this desirable pedagogy, Moreover, the IPSC schools also understood that building emerges as a product of the integrated curriculum, not preaching morals and ethics during two periods of 'moral science' in

A week or fortnight, it is the IPSC culture to balance all aspects of learning cognitive, affective, physical, civic, cultural and even spiritual, It is the IPSC culture to be local, regional, national and international, It is the IPSC norm to be able walk the mountains, chat with the villagers, host outsiders and make them feel like insiders. 
